Jane Manza, a town tax assessor

Jane: We [the assessors] hit the road April 1st. We viewed lake front property. Skip was "drowning" in his property [a lot of water on his property]. We did get on record what needed to be done by April 1.

Merle [Knowles III, recently elected to be a town tax assessor] is a good fit he knows it all already.

We are going from short form and long form [assessing records]. This means, "How many bedrooms and bathrooms?" and "What is kitchen like?" so we can get a more accurate valuation of each property.

Would it be OK to send out a survey to the property owners and ask them to return it? Then, all the people that don't reply, we would personally knock on the door [and see for ourselves]. If we didn't have to step inside, it would save us time.

David D: Can you use satellite pictures?

Jane: Not really. We would need different side angle pictures.

Kristy: I need to look into those [mail] meter programs that have a printer and a scale. I think it would save us some money.

Skip: I agree. Otherwise, it will take years to visit every home.

Jane: We didn't take the time because we had to hustle around to get the pictures.

We did Christy Hicks' [property].

Skip: How long did it take to do that one place?

ook 8 to 10 minutes, including some time just talking.

Aristy: Can we pull the list from TRIO of properties that have buildings versus no buildings, so we can narrow down quickly where to send those surveys?

Jane: I would bet we could. It has a building value on there. Kristy: I think we could print address labels right from TRIO. Are we going to give them self-addressed stamped envelopes?

Jane: They could include a snap shot

Skip: Let's see about a bulk rate for mailing.

David D: Could this just be sent out with the next tax bill in August?

Jane: No, we need it before the tax bill is sent out.

David D: Should you [the assessors] have something to identify you?

[Ideas from different people]: Orange vests, ID badges...

Jane: A magnetic sign on the vehicle.

Kristy: If Johnson's or Ace doesn't have one, then we will...

Skip: So for now, what do you need?

Jane: The OK to mail a survey.

Kristy: Stop in on Tuesday for the Road account.

Skip, you have a password and pin.

Lere are your Freedom of Access Act FAQs. There is a page in the back with a certificate. Learn all you need to learn, then fill it out and bring it back to me in the office. Training is each year.

We did get our warrant for the assessors return for the Washington county taxes \$123,005. The county has a mil rate of 16.09. It was \$113,000 last year.

You have an email for you that came. This will require help from you guys and Larry. In 2018 you made a hazardous mitigation plan. You had not done a lot of these culverts [listed in the mitigation plan] because of a lack of funds. I believe that now they have been done, but I need to talk to Larry.

Skip: Tommy Long road has not been done.

Kristy. It says to return this by May 10.

It asks, "Have any of your projects been completed or deemed unnecessary?"

"Are there any that need to be added?"

Skip: I will see Larry tomorrow I will give him one.

The FEMA paperwork has begun. At first, I was nervous. I thought, "This is a very professional organization to work with." But then, [the FEMA representative] sent me...about 8 correction emails. So, I feel relaxed about that. We should be able to plow through that. I may need pictures.

We did not get any money for the January storms, just for December.

Skip: We will take a look.

o have road money, about \$70,000 and one more cheque for Dale [who is in charge of town road snow removal].

Town 200th Anniversary committee

Kristy: I want to put together some sort of committee. I don't know if anyone wants to help on that.

I think the anniversary will be in January of 2025. But we probably want to celebrate in July. The Grange will want to be involved.

Skip: Advertise for a committee.

Kristy: Maybe talk about a small budget to bring to you later.

Skip: Go ahead and put up a thing for volunteers.

## Property Next To Town Hall That Could Be Purchased By The Town

David D: The person who owns that property next door to us...

Skip: I think we ought to look into that.

David D: It's a very small lot. I don't know what he wants for it.

Carl: You have a problem with the two wells right near that property.

Kristy: If we throw out numbers, we might be too high or too low and insult him.

Jane: It's valued at \$9000 for the first acre. It's hardly worth that.

Foster: A lot of places under an acre in town were still charged as a house lot. You have to have at least an acre of land in order to build on it.

Kristy: Joshua Probst is the owner. It's .46 acre.

ster: We offer \$2000 or \$2500, that could be too low.

wristy: We could say, "You aren't using the land. It's costing \$150 in taxes a year."

In Wesley people buy those 3 or 4 acres and then they don't use them.

Foster: It will be worth more.
